Commissioner Brown called the meeting to order at 10:04 AM. Commissioner Brown led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

- 1. Approval of the minutes of February 28, 2014.** Commissioner Peters made a motion to approve the minutes of February 28, 2014. Commissioner Bloom seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.
- 2. Consideration of Amendment # 6 for additional Preliminary Engineering Services between the Board of Commissioners and American Structurepoint, Inc. for Bass Rd from Scott Rd to Hillegas Rd, Project # 04-264. Cost - \$140,480 (increase).** Bill Hartman, Highway Director, presented this item. He stated this is an 80/20 project so our actual cost is \$28,096. This is for adding a pedestrian path on the bridge on Bass Road over I-69 and some wetland mitigation and some asbestos investigation report on the bridge itself as well. Commissioner Peters said that one of our County Council members has already posed the question of why now? Why the pedestrian cross wasn't thought of upfront and why didn't we consider wetland mitigation at that time? Bill said that this is the point in the contract where wetland mitigation comes. It's not put in until you get through the design and environmental phase. He said we are trying to coordinate the widening on the bridge with INDOT's rehab of the bridge which wasn't going to be scheduled until about 2022. But, when we had the public hearing for the project, there was such an outcry in that hearing to make that part of this project so the connectivity would take place now, we went back to INDOT and they have actually revised their schedule on the rehab of the bridge to coordinate with our widening of the bridge. Commissioner Bloom made a motion to approve Amendment # 6 for additional Preliminary Engineering Services between the Board of Commissioners and American Structurepoint, Inc. for Bass Rd from Scott Rd to Hillegas Rd, Project # 04-264. Cost - \$140,480 (increase) our portion \$28,096. Commissioner Peters seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.
- 3. Consideration of Grant Agreement between the Board of Commissioners and Foellinger Foundation for funding for the Great Kids Make Great Communities program on behalf of Superior Court.** Chris Cloud, Executive Assistant, said this is a grant the County has received for many years from the Foellinger. Judge Pratt runs this program through Superior Court. It used to be an annual and now it is a three year grant in the amount of \$315,000. It funds a position and a small operating budget for the program as well. Commissioner Brown asked if this is operated by the court. Chris said it is a program run by superior court. Commissioner Bloom made a motion to approve the Grant Agreement between the Board of Commissioners and Foellinger Foundation for funding for the Great Kids Make Great Communities program on behalf of Superior Court. Commissioner Peters seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF ALLEN
ORDINANCE DATED March 14, 2014
ORDINANCE NUMBER 03-14-14-07

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Allen approved widespread changes to the Allen County Zoning Ordinance on January 10th, 2014; and

Whereas, Allen County Code needs to be updated to reflect these changes; and

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners has the sole authority to add, amend, or repeal Allen County Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained that:

Section 1. Allen County Code Title 2 – Article 3 shall now read as follows:

ARTICLE 3 – COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Chapter 1 Title and Adoption

2-3-1-1 The Comprehensive Plan for Allen County shall be formally known as "The Comprehensive Plan for the City of Fort Wayne and Allen County" (Plan-It Allen); it may also be cited and referred to as the "Comprehensive Plan". The Comprehensive Plan, containing goals, objectives, strategies, guiding principles, maps, figures, and charts for Community Facilities, Community Identity and Appearance, Economic Development, Environmental Stewardship, Housing and Neighborhoods, Land Use, Transportation, and Utilities, was adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Allen on March 30, 2007.

Chapter 2 Guidance and Consideration

2-3-2-1 Each governmental entity within the planning jurisdiction of the Allen County Plan Commission shall be guided by and give consideration to the general policy and pattern of development set out in the Comprehensive Plan and to other land use policies adopted in this article, including the:

- (a) Authorization, acceptance, or construction of water mains, sewers, connections, facilities, or utilities;
- (b) Authorization, construction, development, alteration, or abandonment of public ways, public places, public lands, public buildings and structures, or public utilities;
- (c) Objectives and policies for future land use development; and
- (d) Adoption, amendment, or repeal of zoning ordinances, (including zoning maps), subdivision control ordinances, historic preservation ordinances, and other land use ordinances.

Chapter 3 Other Allen County Land Use Policies

2-3-3-1

Amendments to the Comprehensive Plan shall be prepared and approved according to the procedures set forth in IC 36-7-4-500 (the 500 series – Comprehensive Plan). The following strategies are also hereby adopted :

- (a) Non-agricultural development surrounding the General Motors site should be limited only to those areas immediately west and south of the plant. Such development should be of an industrial or industrially related service use and must enhance the site design standards established by the General Motors project.
- (b) While local government will not initiate rezoning petitions for real estate in these adjacent areas from the current agricultural classification, favorable consideration may be given to rezoning petitions seeking an industrial category if the request represents either of two (2) circumstances:
 - (1) The project has a direct relationship to the General Motors plant and that its location in such close proximity offers identifiable benefits in the community's interest. No minimum or maximum acreage requirement is necessary in this instance.
 - (2) The project represents an immediate and undivided use of ten or more acres by one industry with a plan proposing site design features that will complement the site screening and access standards established for the area. In this instance, no direct relationship to the General Motors project is necessary.
- (c) Rezoning petitions for real estate without an identified occupancy are not encouraged in the areas immediately south and west of the General Motors site. In instances where the General Motors facility has created an undue hardship on the continued residential use of property immediately surrounding the plant site, the Board of Zoning Appeals may, pursuant to IC 36-7-4-918.4, give favorable consideration to use variance petitions for land uses of a non-retail nature.
- (d) In coordination with local transportation officials, project plan review shall: 1) limit the points of access along Lafayette Center Road between Zubrick and Aboite Roads; and 2) discourage the construction of direct industrial access to Aboite Road.
- (e) Development within the Indianapolis Road/Lafayette Center Road corridor should not disrupt the existing agricultural atmosphere now present in that portion of the community.
- (f) Industrial prospects for which the "large-acreage industrial uses" zoning classification is applicable shall be strongly encouraged. Industrial rezoning of property should occur only in locations where it can be demonstrated that adequate public infrastructure is in place, or committed to be in place, to support the proposed development. The proposed project must represent substantial capital investment and job creation benefits.

Chapter 4 Copy on File

2-3-4-1 A copy of the approved Comprehensive Plan, including all maps and amendments, shall be placed and kept on file in the office of the Allen County Recorder. A copy of the approved Plan shall also be placed and kept on file in the office of the Department of Planning Services and shall be available for public examination during the regular business hours of said offices.

Section 2. Allen County Code Title 2 – Article 4 shall read as follows:

ARTICLE 4 – TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Chapter 1 Title and Adoption

2-4-1-1 A Transportation Plan, prepared by the Northeastern Indiana Regional Coordinating Council and adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Allen, shall be considered the Transportation Plan for the Allen County. It may be cited and referred to as the “Transportation Plan”.

Chapter 2 Guidance and Consideration

2-4-2-1 The Board of Commissioners and other governmental entities within the jurisdiction of the Allen County Plan Commission shall pay reasonable regard to the general policies, objectives, and proposed highway, transit, and pedestrian/bicycle systems improvement projects set forth in the Transportation Plan as part of the review and approval of proposed projects; the authorization, construction, development, and improvement of public streets and roadways; the abandonment of public ways; and other matters relevant to the Transportation Plan.


Chapter 3 Copy on File

2-4-3-1 A copy of the Transportation Plan shall be kept on file in the office of the Board of Commissioners. A copy of the approved Transportation Plan shall also be kept on file in the offices of the Department of Planning Services and the Northeastern Indiana Regional Coordinating Council (NIRCC), and shall be available for public examination during the regular business hours of said offices.


Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective as April 3rd, 2014.



Section 1. Allen County Code Title 4 (Subdivision Control Ordinance) is hereby repealed in its entirety.





R.L. McCoy, Inc.	=	\$794,262.22


The Engineer's Estimate for this project was \$796,001.87.

After reviewing the bids submitted for this project it was determined that two (2) of the bidders R.G. Zachrich Construction and Vernon Nagel, Inc. we're not registered on the Prequalified Contractors listing (this document is on INDOT's webpage at <http://www.in.gov/indot/2740.htm>); as required by the Bid Documents for this project which reference INDOT's 2014 edition of the Standard Specifications, Section 102, which stipulates that the "bidder will be required to prequalify as set out in the rules for Prequalification of Contractors and Bidding, 105 IAC 11, now on file with the Indiana Secretary of State".


Therefore Allen County Highway recommends that the Construction Contract be Awarded to Primco, Inc., in the amount of \$688,780.76



This Agreement, made and entered into this 21 day of March 2014 by and between the Board of Commissioners of the County of Allen, Allen County, Indiana, Party of the First Part, and Primco, Inc., PO Box 9782, 7107 Smith Road, Fort Wayne, IN 46899-9782 Party of the Second Part.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the said Party of the First Part has duly advertised for bids, as required by law, for the construction of:

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the premises and the agreements hereinafter contained, the said Party of the Second Part agrees to sell, and the Party of the first Part agrees to have

constructed by the Party of the Second Part and agrees to buy from them the following materials and supplies at and for the price of Not to Exceed: \$ 688,780.76 (Six-Hundred , Eighty-Eight Thousand, Seven-Hundred, Eighty Dollars and 76/100 Cents)

and it is understood and agreed that the construction and all of said supplies and materials are to comply with the plans and specifications therefore now on file with the Auditor of said County, which plans

It is further stipulated and agreed that the delivery of the supplies and materials herein contracted for, shall be made as requisitioned by the Party of the First Part, by and through its lawful agent or agents, and that after delivery thereof the payment for the same, as well as any other types of claims, shall comply with the following:

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Claims may only be paid if the procedures for approving their payment as set out in the Indiana Code are followed and after appropriate requirements are strictly complied with as may from time to time be amended. Such procedures may include the following conditions and provisions:

1. The Claimant shall file the claim with the County Auditor on forms furnished for that purpose by the County Executive.
2. The Auditor shall present the claim to the County Executive, which shall examine the merits of the claim. The Executive may allow any part of the claim that it finds to be valid.
3. The County Auditor shall publish the claim which has been filed for the consideration of the County Executive and, as appropriate, shall publish the claim for allowance if made by the Courts of the County.
4. The claim filed for the consideration of the Executive shall be published at least three (3) days before the session of the Executive and, as appropriate, a Court claim for allowance shall be published at least three (3) days before the issuance of warrants in payment of those allowances.
5. A claim or allowance shall be published as prescribed by I.C. 5-3-1, and by I.C. 36-2-6-3, as follows: One (1) publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the County of Allen, Indiana
6. If appropriate, in publication of itemized statements filed by highway (or assistant) supervisors for consideration of the Executive, the Auditor shall publish the name of each party and the total amount due each party named in the itemized statements.
7. If appropriate, the County Auditor shall publish one (1) time in accordance with I.C. 5-3-1 a notice of all allowances made by a Circuit or Superior Court. The notice must be published within sixty (60) days after petition for the allowances are made and must state their amount, to whom they are made, and for what purpose they are made.
8. Any contractor, person or party obtaining a bid from the county of Allen, or any of its subdivisions, shall pay, on time and in full, all of its subcontractors, laborers, material suppliers, and those performing services. The board shall withhold money from the contract price in a sufficient amount to pay the subcontractors, laborers, material suppliers and those furnishing services, if necessary, as follows:
 - a. When a public work project is to be performed, the board shall withhold final payment to the contractor until the contractor has paid the subcontractors, material suppliers, laborers, or those furnishing services. However, if there is not a sufficient sum owed to the contractor to pay those bills, the sum owed to the contractor shall be prorated in payment of the bills among the parties entitled.
 - b. To receive payment the subcontractor or subcontractors, material suppliers, laborers, or those furnishing services shall file their claims with the board within sixty (60) days after the labor performed, last material furnished, or last service rendered by them, as provided in section I.C 36-1-12-13.
 - c. If there is no dispute between the parties claiming to be entitled to the money withheld, the board shall pay the claim from the money due the contractor and deduct it from the contract price. The board shall take a receipt for payment made on a claim.
 - d. If there is a dispute between the parties claiming to be entitled to the money withheld, the board shall retain sufficient money to pay the claims until the dispute is settled and the correct amount is determined. However, the board may make a final and complete settlement with the contractor after thirty (30) days after the date for the completion and acceptance of the public work if the board is furnished with satisfactory evidence indicating the payment in full of all subcontractors, material suppliers, laborers, or those furnishing services.
 - e. A claim form must be signed by an individual from the political subdivision or agency who is directly responsible for the project and who can verify:
 1. The quantity of a purchased item; or
 2. The weight or volume of the material applied, in the case of a road, street or bridge

2. The County Executive may approve a claim or contract for supplies only if:
 - a. It finds that the claimant has complied with the contract; and
 - b. The County Auditor certifies in writing that the invoice or bill for the supplies corresponds with the contract.

REGARDING WORK SUPERVISED BY COUNTY SURVEYOR:

The County Executive may allow a contract claim for work that was to be conducted under the supervisions of the County Surveyor, Engineer, Superintendent or Inspector appointed by the Executive, only if that Supervisor certifies in writing on the claim that the work listed in the claim has been performed according to the intent and that the claim is due and owing under the contract. The supervisor's certificate must be filed with the claim.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ISSUANCE OF WARRANTS:

The County Auditor may issue a warrant for money to be paid out of the County Treasury in payment of a claim only if the claim is:

- A. Fully itemized
- B. Verified by the claimant or someone acting in his behalf; and,
- C. filed with the Auditor more than five (5) days before the first day of the meeting of the County Executive at which it is allowed.

COMPLIANCE REQUIRED:

The County Auditor may issue a warrant for money to be paid out of the County Treasury in payment of a claim:

- A. For Supplies; or
- B. On a contract with the County Executive for the execution of a public work;

only if the supplies were purchased or the contract was made in compliance with the Indiana Code.

An Allen County common construction wage committee meeting for projects bidding on Indiana University-Purdue University's Fort Wayne campus has been scheduled for:
