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1 IRVING: Good morning and thank you for attending our  
2 Wednesday, July 9th Commissioner Legislative Session.  
3 This morning I'd like to ask Commissioner Bloom to  
4 lead us in the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of  
5 silence.

6 (At this time, the Pledge of Allegiance was  
7 recited in unison by all present.

8 BLOOM: And now a moment of prayer, please.

9 (At this time, a moment of silence was  
10 observed by all present.)

11 BLOOM: Thank you.

12 IRVING: Thank you. I just can't get either one of  
13 my partners to want to sing it to us, though. You  
14 know, sing something.

15 BLOOM: I'm not up to it today.

16 IRVING: Maybe next week. Approval of the Minutes of  
17 the July 2nd meeting, please.

18 BLOOM: So moved.

19 IRVING: Second it. All in favor say, "Aye."

20 BLOOM: Aye.

21 IRVING: Aye. Motion carries. I think we have an  
22 appointment to the Allen County Community Corrections  
23 this morning.

24 HUDSON: Would you like me to address that,  
25 Commissioner?

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1 IRVING: If you would like to--let's have Susan read  
2 into the record who it would be, and then you can  
3 introduce yourself. We're always glad to have you  
4 here.

5 HUDSON: Thank you very much.

6 ELSER: The name before the Board for consideration  
7 today for an appointment on the Allen County  
8 Community Corrections Advisory Board is Calvert S.  
9 Miller. He will be fulfilling the term of a member  
10 who had to resign, and this will run through December  
11 31st of 2003.

12 IRVING: Who is he replacing or whatever, Sheila?  
13 HUDSON: Commissioner Irving, there are four lay  
14 people on, that are appointed by the Commissioners,  
15 and we are two short--two lay persons short, and one  
16 person just resigned. We have another position open,  
17 so he replaced an attorney that couldn't make the  
18 noon meetings and was not able to come.  
19 IRVING: Okay, so he is going and Cal Miller is--  
20 BLOOM: Not Cal Miller.  
21 IRVING: Calvert.  
22 ELSER: Yes, it's Cal Miller.  
23 IRVING: Yeah, he is going to be on the Board as a  
24 capacity as a lay attorney and--  
25 HUDSON: Yes.

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1 IRVING: --not for County Council?  
2 HUDSON: Yes. Historically we've always had two  
3 County Council fiscal members--  
4 BLOOM: Oh, that's right.  
5 HUDSON: --on the Board, and when Sandra Houlihan  
6 resigned office--  
7 BLOOM: Yes.  
8 HUDSON: --then--and she was on the Board, so he is  
9 really essentially replacing her.  
10 BLOOM: And then who's the other council--  
11 HUDSON: Michael Cunegin--  
12 BLOOM: Okay.  
13 HUDSON: --is the other council member on the Board.  
14 BLOOM: Actually, Ed Rousseau's on that board and I  
15 was the interim--  
16 HUDSON: Yes.  
17 BLOOM: --acting person when Ed was sick--  
18 HUDSON: Yes.  
19 BLOOM: --and there still is an open position?  
20 HUDSON: Yes, ma'am.  
21 BLOOM: I would love to be back on that Board again.  
22 I thoroughly enjoyed that. I love the updates on  
23 what you were doing and everything. I met several  
24 times with the state people, and--  
25 HUDSON: Yes, you did.

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1 BLOOM: --I was instrumental in the construction of  
2 the building. I didn't know there were any openings,  
3 so--  
4 HUDSON: Yes, there are.  
5 BLOOM: --if your Board would consider me as a Board  
6 member, I would like that very much.  
7 HUDSON: Commissioner, the appointment is by the  
8 commissioners, so--  
9 BLOOM: I know, but I'd--  
10 HUDSON: --but you would prefer me to take it--  
11 BLOOM: --feel much more comfortable if--because it's  
12 me putting me on the Board--if your Board would think  
13 that two Commissioners should be on there.  
14 HUDSON: I will--we have a me--we have meeting July  
15 24 and I will make it part of my director's report.  
16 BLOOM: I would appreciate it.  
17 HUDSON: I'd be honored to do that.  
18 BLOOM: Thank you.  
19 HUDSON: Thank you very much.  
20 IRVING: Does this mean--let me qualify this. Does

21 this mean that she has to be nice to Ed and I so we  
22 would agree to this?

23 HUDSON: Yes, ma'am.

24 BLOOM: Boy, I don't like that.

25 IRVING: Do we have a motion to appoint Calvert

1 Miller, please?

2 BLOOM: I'll make a motion that we put this new  
3 appointment on the Community Corrections Advisory  
4 Board.

5 IRVING: I'll second it. All in favor say, "Aye."

6 BLOOM: Aye.

7 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.

8 BLOOM: Thanks.

9 IRVING: Thank you.

10 HUDSON: Commissioners, would it be possible that I  
11 would--since I'm up here, that I could bring the  
12 grant--the bi-anum grant before you?

13 BLOOM: Yeah.

14 HUDSON: This is the 19th and 20th year for the Allen  
15 County Community Corrections Grant, and I'm asking  
16 you, respectfully, to approve the next bi-anum--it's  
17 a--it's quite a large amount of money. I don't have  
18 the exact amount in front of me.

19 IRVING: I have it as two million, six hundred and  
20 thirty-four dollar and three hundred--

21 ELSE: No.

22 IRVING: No. Two million, six hundred and thirty-  
23 four--

24 ELSE: Thousand.

25 IRVING: --thousand, three hundred and twenty-two

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1 dollars [\$2,634,322.00].

2 HUDSON: That's right.

3 BLOOM: And I'll make a motion that we accept this.

4 IRVING: I'll second the motion. All in favor say,  
5 "Aye."

6 BLOOM: Aye.

7 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.

8 HUDSON: Thank you very much, Commissioners.

9 IRVING: Okay, I want to congratulate Community  
10 Corrections. You were--before you fly right out of  
11 here--and give us a little bit of an update of  
12 Community Corrections and their help with the sand  
13 bagging efforts.

14 HUDSON: Yesterday we received a frantic call from  
15 business owners on Tillman Road. A number of  
16 business were under water, and they were losing all  
17 of their--one--one chiropractic business had lost all  
18 his x-ray machine--by the time they got into the  
19 door, it was waist high. So, I had four community  
20 service crews out yesterday, and all four went and we  
21 took our dump truck that the city of Fort Wayne gave  
22 us that we used for our other projects in the--with  
23 the parks, to load sand bags. And so when they were  
24 through taking all this--the contents of the  
25 businesses out, Atz's Ice Cream, next door, then

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1 supplied everybody with ice cream, which was very  
2 nice. And then we went from there--and then until

3 6:30, almost 7:00 last night, there were up to 30  
4 people plus all four supervisors that donated their  
5 time to fill sand bags--

6 BLOOM: Oh, my.

7 HUDSON: --in Tillman tennis courts. So, I'm very  
8 proud of them, and when people think that when people  
9 get in trouble and then they have community service,  
10 that they--they really felt like they were doing  
11 something substantial and worthwhile for this  
12 community, and I'm very proud of that.

13 BLOOM: I'm proud of you.

14 IRVING: I am too.

15 HUDSON: So thank you for asking me, Commissioner.

16 IRVING: Just one question that I do have. Is it  
17 extremely unusual for a business like that to call  
18 direct to Community Corrections or how do they--how  
19 do businesses normally handle this situation?

20 HUDSON: Well, you know, this has been something I  
21 was laboring all day today, where I could put this  
22 information out to the community--

23 BLOOM: Uh-huh (affirmative).

24 HUDSON: --and I was going to talk to some of your  
25 staff today about this, because we do have a

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1 tremendous labor force. It just so happens--

2 BLOOM: Yes.

3 HUDSON: --that I--I knew a number of people that  
4 lived in that area. That they knew that there--that  
5 crews did this type of work for the community. The  
6 first call that was made was to the fire department,  
7 "Can you come out and help us, please," you know,  
8 "we're losing everything."

9 IRVING: Right.

10 HUDSON: And then the second call was to my son who  
11 happened to be a fireman, who then called our  
12 office--

13 IRVING: Okay.

14 HUDSON: --knowing that we had the crews, so--

15 IRVING: Well, last night--

16 BLOOM: So we need that, yeah.

17 IRVING: --last night when I stopped down here, I  
18 know that the South Barn--we had--we had gotten two  
19 or three phone calls from people in the Poe area, and  
20 they were working with the South Barn on getting some  
21 sand and sand bagging done. So, I see the--our  
22 director at the South Barn is here and maybe you  
23 could talk and--

24 HUDSON: I'd be happy--

25 IRVING: --coordinate something--

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1 HUDSON: --to do that.

2 IRVING: --with him.

3 HUDSON: We are organizing the efforts now, and  
4 we're--we're compensating the crew members. Many of  
5 the community service persons work off their  
6 community service--community corrections fees. Their  
7 program fees, their substance abuse fees--what a  
8 better way to do this, and so we're giving--giving  
9 them like double hours, which means double amounts--

10 BLOOM: Exactly.

11 HUDSON: --that they can pay toward their fees.

12 BLOOM: Oh, that's--  
13 HUDSON: And so--  
14 BLOOM: --great.  
15 HUDSON: --I--I--through the rest of the week we're  
16 going to do this, and so I anticipate we'll have  
17 larger crews, and so I will do that.  
18 IRVING: Okay.  
19 HUDSON: Thank you very--  
20 IRVING: Well, thank you--  
21 HUDSON: --much for asking.  
22 IRVING: --very much. Well, that's just wonderful.  
23 BLOOM: Yeah, it is.  
24 IRVING: Okay, next on the agenda, I have a whole  
25 stack of change orders. Let me read through them

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1 first and then I can--  
2 BLOOM: And not too many dollars, so this is good.  
3 IRVING: No, I know. L-A Electric, change order  
4 number 20 is no dollar change. L-A Electric, change  
5 order 22, no dollar change. L-A Electric, change  
6 order 23, \$20,507.00. Current, Incorporated, change  
7 order 25 is a decrease of \$2,358.00. Hagerman  
8 Construction increase, change order number 19 for  
9 \$4,483.00. Fort Wayne Structural Steel, change order  
10 number 13 for \$3,350.00. W.A. Sheets & Son, change  
11 order 25, \$2,997.00. Strahm, change order number 24,  
12 \$2,992.00. L-A Electric, change order number 24 for  
13 \$3,456.00, and ESCO Communication, contract change  
14 order number one for \$15,166.00. I have reviewed  
15 these, and the one that I wanted to point out to my  
16 partner, here, the L-A Electric, the \$20,507.00,  
17 there were some areas of the electrical--for the data  
18 and communication that was cost after the ESCO bill,  
19 that we need more outlets. And so they've gone--  
20 completely redone the building, as far as being able  
21 to provide the data. So that was the large one on  
22 that. The other one for 15,000 [\$15,166.00]--  
23 BLOOM: ESCO.

24 IRVING: Yeah, hang on a second here. I wish I had  
25 these on top when I went through them. Here it is.  
0017  
1 That was to install--we had to end up going through a  
2 loop system with--it's kind of a remarkable--it's  
3 called the Loop of the Raceway Systems. Isn't that  
4 something. And it's the ceilings--what has happened,  
5 is that there is so much--there's--you know, you got  
6 your sewage up there, you got your electrical up  
7 there, you've got all your duct work and everything,  
8 and so we had to do some changing because some areas  
9 we were not able to actually run the wire, so we're  
10 having to put them in a sleeve-type situation. So  
11 these have all been approved for a total of  
12 \$50,593.00, and I'd ask for a motion.

13 BLOOM: I'll make the motion we accept these.  
14 IRVING: I'll second it. All in favor say, "Aye."  
15 BLOOM: Aye.  
16 IRVING: Thank you very much. Pass those down  
17 to you, okay.  
18 BLOOM: I only have one.  
19 IRVING: And we also have a--oh, you're pretty good--



20 a change order for Industrial Piping & Engineering  
21 for \$707.00.  
22 BLOOM: Yes, and I have reviewed this and I would  
23 like to make a motion to accept the change order to  
24 Industrial Piping & Engineering for the cost of  
25 \$707.00.

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1 IRVING: Second it. All in favor say, "Aye."  
2 BLOOM: Aye.  
3 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried. Next on our agenda is  
4 approval of a letter of support for Pathfinders  
5 Services for the Indiana Housing Finance Authority.  
6 I think we have our attorney here today.  
7 FISHERING: Ladies?  
8 IRVING: Good morning.  
9 BLOOM: Good morning.  
10 FISHERING: Bill Fishering, the County Attorney.  
11 Pathfinders Services, which is not-for-profit in  
12 Huntington is applying to the Indiana Housing Finance  
13 Authority for funds to assist low income homeowners,  
14 principally, one wage earner situations, in obtaining  
15 mortgage for home ownership in a 17 county area,  
16 including Allen County. Now, you all have dealt with  
17 the Indiana Housing Authority before, and typically  
18 when people are going down there to request grants or  
19 other funds, they require letters of support from  
20 local, elected officials. They ha--Pathfinder has  
21 asked that you write a letter of support to the  
22 Indiana Housing Authority. A draft of that letter  
23 has been prepared and support their attempt to obtain  
24 funds to assist low income people in obtaining  
25 mortgages. Pathfinder, as I say, is 501-C3 to the

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1 best of my knowledge, it's a United Way agency out of  
2 Huntington County.  
3 BLOOM: I'd like to make a motion that we approve our  
4 letter of support for Pathfinders--for Huntington  
5 County to the Housing Authority.  
6 IRVING: Second it. All in favor say, "Aye."  
7 BLOOM: Aye.  
8 IRVING: Aye.  
9 FISHERING: Thank you very much.  
10 IRVING: Thank you very much. Do you have any other  
11 business before us?  
12 FISHERING: I don't believe so.  
13 IRVING: Okay, thank you very much.  
14 BLOOM: Thanks.  
15 IRVING: I might come and look out your window--  
16 FISHERING: Yeah, and see--  
17 IRVING: --Bill, and see the water. Because hear  
18 that some of the streets that are flooded--Bill's on  
19 the 11th floor, so--  
20 BLOOM: He can see these, huh?  
21 IRVING: --I might have to go--uh-huh (affirmative).  
22 Approve a supplemental agreement number one between  
23 American Consulting, Incorporated and Allen County  
24 for Bass Road, from Hillegas to Hadley Road, an  
25 increase of \$248,200.00.

1 BLOOM: This is the--  
2 IRVING: Good morning.

3 BLOOM: Good morning.  
4 FITCH: Good morning.  
5 BLOOM: This is a supplemental agreement to American  
6 and I make a motion we approve this.  
7 IRVING: Second it. All in favor say, "Aye."  
8 BLOOM: All the--Aye. All the new development going  
9 on out there and we've certainly got issues to deal  
10 with and this is for the engineering cost.  
11 IRVING: Approve change order number five between  
12 Primco, Incorporated and Allen County for Hillegas  
13 Road project. It's a \$5,436.10 increase. It's an  
14 80/20 project, so our share is \$1,087.82.  
15 BLOOM: So moved.  
16 IRVING: Second it. All in favor say, "Aye."  
17 BLOOM: Aye.  
18 IRVING: Aye.  
19 IRVING: Mike, she did it without you today.  
20 FITCH: Okay, Mike Fitch--  
21 IRVING: Do we have something else--oh, wait a  
22 minute--  
23 FITCH: --executive director--  
24 IRVING: --let's--let's--  
25 FITCH: --Allen County Highway Department.

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1 IRVING: --skip over agenda item number eight, then.  
2 BLOOM: Well, let's let him tell us who he is.  
3 FITCH: Okay, Mike Fitch, Allen County Highway  
4 Department.  
5 BLOOM: Hi, Mike.  
6 IRVING: Hi, Mike.  
7 FITCH: Here to answer any questions you may have.  
8 BLOOM: Actually the traffic posting change in  
9 Covington, we're posting a 30 mile an hour?  
10 IRVING: Are you taking the meeting over?  
11 BLOOM: I just--I did.  
12 IRVING: Oh, so can I--  
13 BLOOM: I'll make a motion we approve that.  
14 IRVING: I'll second it. All in favor say, "Aye."

24 BLOOM: Oh, 10,000--

2 then we got problems here, too. I would like to see
