1 IRVING: Good morning, and welcome to the October  
2 29th, 2003 Commissioners Legislative Session.  
3 Commissioner Rousseau, would you like to lead us in  
4 the pledge and a moment of silence?

5 (At this time, the Pledge of Allegiance  
6 was recited in unison, and a moment of  
7 silence was observed by all.)

8 ROUSSEAU: Thank you.

9 IRVING: Thank you, Commissioner Rousseau. This  
10 morning before we start our regular Legislative  
11 agenda items, we have an update by our Emergency  
12 Management Director, Ed LaRocque. Good morning, Ed.  
13 How are you this morning.

14 BLOOM: Good morning.

15 LAROCQUE: Good morning, Commissioners. Good to see  
16 you all. I was glad that you have given me this  
17 opportunity. I wanted to give you a brief update on  
18 some of the Homeland Security grants that we've  
19 applied for in conjunction with the other folks in  
20 our community. Good news. The first Homeland  
21 Security grant that we applied for back--I think the  
22 end of August is when we had to have that first grant  
23 application in for \$255,000.00 has been approved by  
24 the State. The equipment list is still subject to a  
25 little bit of further review by the Federal

1 Government, but the State doesn't see there to be any  
2 problem with that, so we can't--can't exactly spend  
3 the money yet, but everything is fine as far as the  
4 State goes.

5 IRVING: Great.

6 LAROCQUE: So we should--

7 ROUSSEAU: Now, is this grant distributed to other  
8 municipalities?

9 LAROCQUE: This grant is--will be utilized by most of  
10 the political subdivisions within the County,  
11 including New Haven, including Woodburn, Monroeville,  
12 most of the Volunteer Fire Departments, and of course  
13 the Sheriff's Department as well as the City of Fort  
14 Wayne Police, Fire--

15 ROUSSEAU: Okay.

16 LAROCQUE: --EMS will all benefit from the equipment  
17 that will be purchased through this.

18 IRVING: Great.

19 LAROCQUE: The second grant--that was required to be  
20 submitted by the end of September for \$841,000.00.  
21 We have not received the formal approval letter yet,  
22 but I have talked to the State. They had a couple of  
23 minor questions, and that is just a matter of waiting  
24 for the State to finish shuffling the paperwork on  
25 that. That should be back soon. So, first

1 responders will start to--start to see some  
2 equipment. We'll be able to start to order for them  
3 short--short order.

4 IRVING: And Ed, that does also include the other  
5 political subunits, too.

6 LAROCQUE: Yes, and just--

7 IRVING: This is a shared grant that we applied for.  
8 Then we sat down with the committee and determined  
9 what would the City of Fort Wayne need, what does the  
10 County need, what does New Haven need. Is that  
11 correct?

12 LAROCQUE: Yes. You appointed a subcommittee of the  
13 Emergency Management Advisory--

14 IRVING: Right.

15 LAROCQUE: --Council to help go through this and  
16 determine all the needs for the first responders, and  
17 that's worked very well that way. Everybody's gotten  
18 some input and it wasn't just, you know, one entity  
19 trying to dictate to everybody. Everybody got--

20 BLOOM: Great.

21 LAROCQUE: --got their input, so--

22 IRVING: Good. When do you think we'll get the  
23 final--

24 LAROCQUE: Green light to--

25 IRVING: --"A-Okay" letter. Yes.

1 LAROCQUE: I would imagine any day.

2 IRVING: Good.

3 LAROCQUE: And then, you know, some of the equipment  
4 that the State already has a bid price contract set  
5 we can go ahead and order and then, of course, some  
6 of the equipment that's a little more high dollar  
7 will have to go through the bidding process per the  
8 direction of the Auditor and Purchasing.

9 IRVING: So Allen County may be getting a pretty big  
10 Christmas present, you think?

11 LAROCQUE: Well, about a million dollars  
12 [\$1,000,000.00] for first responders.

13 IRVING: We appreciate the job you're doing, and--

14 LAROCQUE: Thanks.

15 IRVING: --I know you've got another little grant up  
16 your sleeve you're working on--

17 LAROCQUE: Yes, ma'am.

18 IRVING: --and we'll look forward to your report  
19 before that is submitted.

20 LAROCQUE: Thanks for your support. Appreciate it.

21 IRVING: Thank you very much, Ed.

22 BLOOM: Thank you.

23 IRVING: Did either one of the partners have any  
24 questions from Ed? (No response.) Okay.

25 BLOOM: Just good job.

1 IRVING: Great job. Approval of the Minutes for the  
2 October 22nd Legislative Session.

3 BLOOM: So move.

4 ROUSSEAU: Second.

5 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

6 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

7 BLOOM: Aye.

8 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried. Rezoning--

9 BLOOM: I wasn't even here.

10 IRVING: Well, Ed and I carried you on that one,  
11 okay?

12 BLOOM: Okay.

13 IRVING: Okay. Rezoning Petition 1494/03 to rezone  
14 property and approve a primary plat development plan  
15 for development of 319 lots in a residential

16 subdivision. This is located at the 3100 block of  
17 Woods Road. The south side of the 2500 through the  
18 3100 blocks of Hunter Street, and the present zoning  
19 is Unincorporated Allen County, but it's  
20 A-1/Agricultural and in Hunteertown RSP-1/Residential.  
21 Boy, that's a lot, Michelle. This was a--a little  
22 tweaking with Hunteertown, but I think that we've  
23 established good communications, and I think we'll  
24 see more of a housing boom out there because of this.  
25 Michelle, would--

1 WOOD: That's correct.  
2 IRVING: --you like to tell us a little bit about  
3 this.  
4 WOOD: Michelle Wood, Department of Planning  
5 Services. As you described, it is 319 lots proposed  
6 on 123 acres. It's just adjacent to the west  
7 boundary of Hunteertown limits, and a portion of it is  
8 within Hunteertown. So, for this rezoning petition to  
9 be passed it needs to be approved by your Board, and  
10 then also it will go to the Town Board in Hunteertown  
11 where they will have to approve their portion of the  
12 site. And our Plan Commission did recommend approval  
13 and a due pass for the rezoning.

14 This did take two months to go through the  
15 system. It was originally on our September agenda at  
16 which time it was deferred for 30 days for Hunteertown  
17 to decide to--work out some issues, and decide to  
18 provide utilities, which they did. And at the  
19 October hearing it was approved.

20 IRVING: And this has a density of what, 2.5, am I  
21 correct?

22 WOOD: It's 2.6.

23 IRVING: 2.6 density on it?

24 WOOD: That's very similar to other projects that  
25 have been--similar or less than other projects in the

0012

1 Hunteertown area in the recent past.

2 IRVING: Any questions?

3 BLOOM: I'll make a motion that we approve the  
4 Rezoning Petition 1494/03.

5 ROUSSEAU: Second.

6 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

7 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

8 BLOOM: Aye.

9 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.

10 BLOOM: Thank you.

11 IRVING: And we have a plat for signature?

12 WOOD: Uh-huh (affirmative).

13 IRVING: Okay.

14 WOOD: This is for The Cliffs. 67 lots. It's on the  
15 north side of Aboite Center Road. It is almost to  
16 the County Line. It is proposed to be a gated  
17 community, which at this time, we don't have gated  
18 communities in the County. That's something that the  
19 Plan Commission has been working on to discuss, but--  
20 at this time, it's just a traditional single family  
21 subdivision, and it is on private streets.

22 IRVING: I want to clarify just for our audience.

23 It's--we do have, in process, a gated community, but

24 it is 24 hour manned by the Sheriff's Department--  
25 WOOD: That's correct. There are--

0013

1 IRVING: --or off-duty--  
2 WOOD: --certain conditions to allow that.  
3 IRVING: Right. But we do have one. This one was  
4 for an unmanned--  
5 WOOD: That's correct.  
6 IRVING: --gated community, and that's why that has  
7 not been approved yet. The gates cannot go up until  
8 we get something in our Code book that can address  
9 that.

10 WOOD: Absolutely.  
11 IRVING: Can we sign this afterwards?

12 WOOD: Yes, we may.

13 IRVING: Okay.

14 WOOD: Thank you.

15 IRVING: Thank you very much. Contract between the  
16 Division of Disability, Aging and Rehabilitative  
17 Services, Blind and Visually Impaired Services and  
18 Allen County for vending services.

19 BLOOM: Good morning.

20 FISHERING: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen.

21 IRVING: Good morning. How are you?

22 FISHERING: Fine. I'm Bill Fishering, the County  
23 Attorney. FSSA, which is the State Agency that  
24 administers a variety of social service programs,  
25 desires for you all to enter into a contract, so that

0014

1 they may provide blind concession services in five of  
2 your buildings. We've been doing this for a number  
3 of years. This is the largest number of buildings  
4 we've ever approved. But after some lengthy  
5 negotiations, I think we have fairly well established  
6 what machines will be in what buildings. This is  
7 their form--contract. It's not exactly what we might  
8 want, but negotiating with the State just doesn't  
9 seem to be worth the time over the issues that are  
10 involved. So, with that said, I would recommend we  
11 execute it. It is for a period of four years.

12 ROUSSEAU: So move.

13 BLOOM: Second.

14 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

15 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

16 BLOOM: Aye.

17 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried. Thank you very much.  
18 And the contract is here for us to sign?

19 FISHERING: Yes.

20 IRVING: Okay. Thank you very much. I kind of  
21 figured that you were going to add that into the  
22 record. The request by the Allen County Department  
23 of Health to establish a "Sick-Leave Bank" for two  
24 employees. Well, good morning.

25 BLOOM: Good morning, Loren.

0015

1 ROBERTSON: Good morning.

2 IRVING: I see the posters have been popping up.

3 ROBERTSON: They are. They are everywhere.

4 IRVING: Yes.

5 ROBERTSON: Also being greatly received from the  
6 community, too, so--

7 IRVING: Great.

8 ROBERTSON: Commissioners, thank you--Loren  
9 Robertson, Department of Health, Administrator. Two  
10 employees of the Department of Health have been faced  
11 with a very serious, extended illness. What we would  
12 like is Commissioner approval to establish a  
13 sick-leave--I think it's a vacation bank. Where  
14 vacation time can be donated by--

15 BLOOM: Yes.

16 ROBERTSON: --other employees for their use during  
17 their treatment and hopeful--and recovery.

18 BLOOM: And we've done this in other departments, and  
19 it is a process that we have done in our policy  
20 manual. And we do have to give permission to do  
21 this, and I would like to make a motion that the  
22 request by the Board of Health to establish the  
23 "Sick-Leave Bank" for two employees be established.

24 ROUSSEAU: Second.

25 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

0016

1 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

2 BLOOM: Aye.

3 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.

4 BLOOM: Thank you.

5 ROBERTSON: I'd like to thank Commissioner Bloom for  
6 helping me work on this, and you for approving it.  
7 Thank you.

8 IRVING: Thank you.

9 ROUSSEAU: I wish I'd had a more elegant second  
10 there. Somehow I couldn't--it was just a plain, fast  
11 little talk and then I just said, "Second."

12 IRVING: Would you like to take a moment to--

13 ROUSSEAU: Is there a time--

14 BLOOM: Thank you, Loren. Next time it's--

15 ROUSSEAU: Well, no--

16 BLOOM: --you can do it.

17 ROUSSEAU: --but next time I'm going to have a more  
18 elegant "Second." Be ready for it.

19 BLOOM: Okay.

20 IRVING: Okay. I will hang on to my seat. You had  
21 your chance last week, Ed, remember, when Linda  
22 wasn't here, and you did make motions right on  
23 schedule.

24 ROUSSEAU: Yeah--

25 IRVING: I was very proud of you.

0017

1 ROUSSEAU: --Linda, you weren't here and it was--I  
2 had a field day. Thank you.

3 BLOOM: I'm so glad--you're welcome. I'll try and do  
4 it again, soon.

5 IRVING: Yeah, but the red lipstick he wore last week  
6 to mimic you was a little more than what we can  
7 handle. Approve Supplemental Agreement #2 between  
8 Rita Ann Gabriel and Associates and Allen County for  
9 additional appraisal services for the Grabill Road  
10 Project. \$1,000.00 increase.

11 BLOOM: So moved.

12 ROUSSEAU: Second.

13 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

14 ROUSSEAU: Aye.



15 BLOOM: Aye.  
16 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.  
17 BLOOM: Let him tell us who he is.  
18 IRVING: Well, are you running the meeting or am I?  
19 BLOOM: Well, sometime--speak up.  
20 FITCH: Mike Fitch, Allen County Highway Department.  
21 Good morning.  
22 IRVING: Good morning.  
23 BLOOM: Good morning.  
24 IRVING: Approve and award the following contracts;  
25 bids to be opened on Tuesday, yesterday. I happened  
0018  
1 to walk in while they were opening these up, and I  
2 guess we got some real good prices. The first one is  
3 Bid Reference #33-03 for Traffic Control Materials.  
4 The second was for Bid Reference 34-03 for Corrugated  
5 Steel Pipe Materials, and the third one was 35-03 for  
6 Liquid Calcium Magnesium Chloride. Would you like to  
7 address those, Mike?  
8 FITCH: Yes. We received three--well, lets see of I  
9 can get 'em in order here. The traffic control  
10 materials we--well, get the right sheet here.  
11 IRVING: Okay.  
12 FITCH: I don't have it in my packet.  
13 BLOOM: What are we doing? Corrugated--no.  
14 FITCH: Do you have it in your--  
15 IRVING: Do you have a copy of it?  
16 BLOOM: Now, wait a minute.  
17 ELSER: I passed two of them down already.  
18 BLOOM: No, wait a minute. No. All I have is the  
19 corrugated pipe.  
20 FITCH: Thought I had it in here. Okay.  
21 ELSER: Here's the calcium and--  
22 BLOOM: Okay, but where's the traffic control  
23 material?  
24 FITCH: Okay. Excuse me. There's a note on my sheet  
25 here. It says that has been tabled--request to table  
0019  
1 that until 11/5/03.  
2 BLOOM: What? The traffic control--  
3 FITCH: So they must not have the--  
4 IRVING: Okay.  
5 BLOOM: Okay.  
6 FITCH: --a bid tab completed yet. So we'll--  
7 BLOOM: All right. So we're going to do the  
8 corrugated steel pipe, please.  
9 FITCH: Corrugated steel pipe--  
10 IRVING: Well, let's make a motion on that to table  
11 that until November 5th of '03. That's Bid Reference  
12 33-03.  
13 BLOOM: So moved.  
14 ROUSSEAU: Second.  
15 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."  
16 ROUSSEAU: Aye.  
17 BLOOM: Aye.  
18 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.  
19 BLOOM: All right. Now, corrugated pipe.  
20 FITCH: Okay. Corrugated metal pipe. We received  
21 bids from three vendors. Midwest Tile, Debco Metals,  
22 and St. Regis Culverts. Typically, what we do--we--  
23 we accept all bids. They submit prices on numerous

24 sizes of pipe and types of pipe, and what we do--we  
25 accept all bids, and when we actually order the pipe

1 that we need--the specific pipe, we order it from the  
2 lowest bid in that category.  
3 BLOOM: Okay.  
4 IRVING: Okay.  
5 FITCH: It's--otherwise it--  
6 IRVING: And that is--if anyone has a question, we do  
7 have that on record--  
8 FITCH: Yes.  
9 IRVING: --both in your department and Purchasing?

10 FITCH: Yes.  
11 BLOOM: Uh-huh (affirmative).  
12 IRVING: Okay.  
13 FITCH: Yes, right.  
14 IRVING: Now, Bid Ref--do we have a motion to accept  
15 the corrugated steel pipe materials?

16 BLOOM: So moved.  
17 ROUSSEAU: Second.  
18 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."  
19 ROUSSEAU: Aye.  
20 BLOOM: Aye.  
21 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.  
22 ROUSSEAU: Okay, I--  
23 IRVING: Now--  
24 ROUSSEAU: --get to do the salt thing.  
25 IRVING: Okay. Liquid calcium magnesium chloride or

0021  
1 better known as "salt."  
2 FITCH: We received one bid from Great Lakes  
3 Chloride, and we award--recommend awarding it to  
4 Great Lakes. It's in the amount of 20,000 gallons  
5 more or less--  
6 BLOOM: It's not salt.  
7 FITCH: --as needed by the Highway Department.  
8 IRVING: It's kind of like it.  
9 BLOOM: No, it isn't. It isn't salt. It's--

10 ROUSSEAU: Well, it takes the place of salt.  
11 BLOOM: --liquid calcium.  
12 FITCH: Liquid chloride.  
13 ROUSSEAU: I have a special interest in this  
14 because--  
15 BLOOM: Why?  
16 IRVING: It rusts your car better than the rest?  
17 ROUSSEAU: --it gives me a chance to say something.  
18 I'd like to make a motion that we approve 20,000  
19 gallons more or less as needed, as determined by the  
20 staff of the Allen County Highway Department. And I  
21 now make a motion to pass this.  
22 BLOOM: Oh, I'll second that. It was so eloquent.  
23 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."  
24 ROUSSEAU: Aye.  
25 BLOOM: Aye.

0022  
1 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried.  
2 ROUSSEAU: See now that's class.  
3 IRVING: Commissioner Rousseau, you could make  
4 Commissioner Irving extremely happy if we did not  
5 have to use any of this the entire winter.

6 ROUSSEAU: I agree with you.

7 BLOOM: All right. Now, we have traffic postings.

8 IRVING: Okay. We have two traffic postings. Would  
9 you like to read them, Susan?

10 ELSER: We have Covington Road from West Hamilton  
11 Road to 2,150 feet west of West Hamilton Road, post  
12 speed limit twenty--25--must be 25 miles per hour  
13 "When Flashing." And West Hamilton Road from  
14 Covington Road to 1,600 feet north of Covington Road,  
15 post speed limit "25 When Flashing."

16 BLOOM: So moved.

17 ROUSSEAU: Second.

18 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

19 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

20 BLOOM: Aye.

21 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried. Okay. Under Other  
22 Business we have approval of award for Seiler  
23 Instruments - 4 Trimble GeoXT 512MB GPS units,  
24 software and accessories for a total award of  
25 \$32,200.00.

0023

1 FITCH: Yes.

2 BLOOM: These will be used--these are handheld GPS--

3 FITCH: Yeah. GPS units.

4 BLOOM: Three will be utilized by the Highway  
5 Department. The fourth--the GIS Department to be--  
6 for departments to be trained like the Surveyor and  
7 the Sheriff's Department, so that they can utilize  
8 this without buying their own. It will be a shared  
9 piece of equipment, and I'll make a motion that we  
10 accept these.

11 ROUSSEAU: Second.

12 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

13 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

14 BLOOM: Aye.

15 IRVING: Aye. Motion carried. Do we have any other  
16 business?

17 FITCH: That's all we have. Thank you very much.

18 IRVING: Any other business to come before us?

19 ELSER: None today.

20 IRVING: Can I have an approval to waive the 2nd  
21 Reading on any matters--

22 ROUSSEAU: So move.

23 BLOOM: Second.

24 IRVING: All in favor say, "Aye."

25 ROUSSEAU: Aye.

0024

1 BLOOM: Aye.

2 IRVING: Aye. I do want to go on record before we  
3 end that Ed Rousseau did not wear red lipstick last  
4 Wednesday, okay.

5 ROUSSEAU: I did everything that--my part and--

6 IRVING: I know.

7 ROUSSEAU: --Commissioner Bloom's part, but I refused  
8 to wear the lipstick.

9 IRVING: I know. I know, and we all in the community  
10 appreciate that, too.

11 ROUSSEAU: I tried her slacks on. That didn't work.

12 IRVING: Do we have any comments from the audience?  
13 (No response.) Any comments from the audience? (No
